



The Pit Stop

The History of Corvette Racing Part-6 The C-4 (continued) Back to Racing

For 1985 Chevrolet gave the Corvette a much needed boost in power. A 25 HP gain, up to 230, over the 1984 model, through a port fuel injection system. Car and Driver tested the 85 Corvette resulting in a 14.4 second quarter mile and a speed of 97 MPH. Top speed was 150.

The SCCA had initiated a "showroom stock" class in 1984 with sponsorship from Playboy and Escort Radar Detector Company. In 85 they introduced a "Super Sports" division, which would be home to the Corvette, and rivals Porsche and Nissan, among others. Porsche would run its front engine 944, while the 300 ZX Turbo would be Nissan's entry. Tommy Morrison, Dick Guldstrand, and Jim Cook were three teams preparing Corvettes for the series. Working with Corvette Engineering it was decided that the teams would help each other and the other Corvette teams by sharing information gained during research and development. The testing was done primarily with Dick Guldstrand doing the driving. As has been noted in earlier articles, Guldstrand had been racing and developing Corvettes for better than two decades. Goodyear would provide the racing rubber and the Girlock Company the brakes. Along with a new quick-change system for the brakes the teams also developed a quick rig for refueling.

The series would be made of six races. The races would be of different times, ranging from a low of 3 hours to the longest, 24 hours. The opening race was at Riverside in California. After 24 hours Corvettes were 1 and 2. The victory was sweet and sweeter still when Corvettes captured all six races in the series. Porsche and Nissan went 0 for 6, a complete shut out!

The big news for 1986 was that Playboy sponsorship was out. The new Escort Series introduced a "GT" class, created for the Nissans, Porsches and Corvettes only. It was thought that both Nissan and Porsche had developed quicker cars that would be more competitive and end Corvette's domination of the series. As it turned out the Nissans were not up to the challenge, but Porsche, with world class international drivers provided competition for the Corvettes. The Porsches were often faster than the Corvettes and started form the pole position in many races. The downfall for Porsche was that their turbocharged engines were quite thirsty and required additional pit stops. The end result was that the Corvettes, for a 2nd year, took the checkered flag first in every race.

For 1987 the Porsches continued to go quick, but improvements in the Corvette, like larger brakes, a six-speed transmission, and chassis improvements, kept the Corvettes an equal to the best Germany had. For a 3rd year Corvettes, along with mechanical failures, kept Porsche from Victory Lane. At seasons end the SCCA banned Corvette form competing in the series. In a surprise move Porsche was also given the boot! Next-The Corvette Challenge & The IMSA Camel GT

How Corvette Racing Prepares for an Endurance Race

Our friends at <u>Mobil 1 The Grid</u> are featuring <u>Corvette Racing</u> in this discussion on how athe team prepares for an endurance race. Joining the conversation is Corvette Racing's Eric Miller, the Assistant Race Engineer for the #3 C8.R.

Eric made his way to the Corvette Racing team at Pratt & Miller by working his way up through the various programs. He says his job is to get the team's race engineer all the information possible to make those critical decisions during the race.

He says once they are at the track, there are some big decisions to be made including tire compounds. Eric says they try to be prepared for everything as anything can happen that requires the team to change their plans for the rest of the race. He says:

"The first hours is all about execution, just making sure that you're keeping the car together, that it's performing well, and that you're getting through the pit stops and drivers are well educated about how the track is changing, and in that last four hours that's when you're really working on timings and all the hypothetical scenarios that can come out."

This is where the team plays a crucial part in a successful race. As the assistant race engineer, Eric Miller helps with the technical analysis, simulation, and strategy of the #3 Corvette Racing and relays the information back to the race engineer to make the big decisions.




