### **GM Restarts C8 Assembly After Tornado**

General Motors restarted operations at its assembly plant on December 20th, nine days after a violent tornado swept through Kentucky and damaged the facility. GM is not taking any chances and will be scrapping any Corvettes that show damage. This includes not only the cars being assembled on the line at the time of the tornado, but will also include the finished cars parked outside the factory waiting for shipment.

According to Corvette Action Center, approximately 115 Corvettes inside the assembly plant "were damaged beyond repair and are being scrapped. Dealers with customer orders for their cars will have to resubmit the orders into GM's Order Workbench System." Hopefully the affected customers will be pushed to the front of the line and not have to wait a long time for their replacement car.

Because of the potential for contamination and damage to the electronics from the water that got inside the plant and onto these open cars, General Motors made the difficult decision to destroy them with a crusher.

Estimates of <u>115-122 Corvettes that were lost</u> have abounded and now thanks to our friend Kornel Werner, we have these two photos of those condemned Corvettes.



Very sad to see these going away, but very understandable as GM wants to clear the board and give their customers whose Corvette dreams were delayed by the storm a 2022 Corvette that they can drive worry-free.

As a very young Corvette enthusiast in the mid-1950's, my early days of reading car magazines meant that I'd scour the pages for anything published about GM's sport car. After all my dad owned a red '56 that I was nuts about.

In many of these article's photos of the prematurely whitehaired Zora Arkus-Duntov would be predominant, Duntov eventually became the chief engineer of the corvette and later affectionately known as "Godfather".

How ironic that it was some thirty-five years later as editor of Vette Magazine, I'd wind up not only meeting Duntov, but becoming friends with he and his wife Elfi. Not only would I see him at the many corvette shows I attended, but also on business trips to Michigan from my then New Jersey based, a meet-up at Zora's house was always on the schedule. He made me feel right at home.

And because I was usually driving the latest corvette press car, Zora could hardly wait to get behind the wheel of whatever one I rolled into his driveway. It mattered not that he was in his eighties at that time, his eyes lit up at the sight of the new 'Vette and I would throw him the keys and off we would go, usually at a rapid clip,

During one of our phone conversations, I mentioned that I was a private pilot and he told me he was, too. In fact, he owned a Rockwell Commander 112A that he kept hangered at Detroit City Airport and suggested we would go flying on his next visit.

And that's what we did.

Zora's retractable gear Rockwell was a beauty, N1105J white and golf with orange trim. The company built 1154 112's between 1972 and 1979 and I'd never been in one. Yet I have to say, that given Zora's advance age, I wouldn't have considered a flight with him had I not been a pilot myself in a dual controlled aircraft.

Of course, Duntov had to go biannual flight reviews and FAA medicals, but air traffic controllers had difficulty understanding his radio calls, his heavy Russian accent and gravelly voice often indecipherable. Since we had matching headsets, he agreed to let me converse

with controllers as we headed north on a lovely 1990 summer afternoon to ST. Claire county International Airport near Port Huron, where he wanted to show me an experimental aircraft that he had an interest in, because he wanted to build an fly one.

None of his friends were for the idea, but I had to admire Zora for refusing to let the old man in. He always had a sparkle in his eye, kept the revs up, his mind always moving ahead to new ideas and projects, long after his mandatory retirement from GM at age 65. A few years later, after our flight he sold 05 Jouliet and bought an engineless, single-seat ZB-5, with hopes of setting a piston-powered speed record, of all things. These aircraft had a high fatality rate and no one wanted to see him finish the plane nor attempt a flight, and Zora's goal was further pushed back when he was diagnosed with lung cancer in the summer of 1995.

We lost him the following April, and I attended the celebration of his life at the National Corvette Museum where he and Elfi's ashes are interred as part of the Zora Arkus-Duntov exhibit.

His accomplishments were extraordinary, a Le Mans class winner, world records at Pike's Peak, escaping the Nazis and running black market gold during WW II, creating the Ardun cylinder heads, but mostly he's remembered for the remarkable performance pedigree he gave Corvette.

What a gift I had in knowing him and that lovely day in the skies over Michigan, one that I will always remember.

### National Corvette Museum Spared Any Significant Damage During December Storm, NCM Motorsports Park ReceivesDamage

During the historic storms on December 11, 2021, the National Corvette Museum was spared any significant damage. All staff - National Corvette Museum, NCM Motorsports Park, and NCM Insurance - were reported as safe.

Fifteen hours after the events, the curatorial team verified that all the artifacts and vehicles in the collection were reported secure. Thirty-six hours after the storm, all individuals with an artifact on loan to the Museum were notified that their loaned items were not in harm's way.

While much of the storm damage was isolated to the Museum's Amphitheater, the Museum was closed over the weekend while crews restored power, cleared roadways of debris, and ensured that our areas were safe once again. We appreciate the calls, e-mails, and check-ins on our staff and institutions.

Our closure was necessary due to the circumstances, but we apologize for any inconvenience you may have encountered and appreciate your patience as we work through this unprecedented situation.

Unfortunately, the NCM Motorsports Park did not have the same fate as the Museum. The Motorsports Park is temporarily unsafe to welcome guests, and all activities are suspended until further notice. Insurance adjusters and crews have begun the assessment and clean-up efforts to help determine our rebuilding plan of the affected areas.

Our hearts are with those across the Commonwealth who these storms have impacted. Anyone who wishes to assist the Bowling Green community can learn to support by visiting <a href="mailto:bqky.org">bqky.org</a>.

3) Although they looked exactly alike these 2 cars had none of the body part in common. The fiberglass body panels used on the Grand Sport were roughly half the thickness of the production panels to save weight.

#### **63**-1968 to 1982

4) The Sting Ray name was not used on the 1968 Corvette but return in 1969 ... Spelt as Stingray.

#### **4-1984** to 1996

5) Chevrolet had contracted with Lotus to convert then into LT5 powered prototypes for the ZR1 project.

#### **65**-1997 to 2004

6) It took 55 hours to build the new C5, down from 70 hours that it took to build the C4.




