The Pit Stop

This is a follow up on an earlier article Seizure of 1959 Corvette Prompts Kansas Lawmakers to Review VIN Mandate for Antique Vehicles

Remember the <u>1959 Corvette seized six years ago</u> by the Kansas Highway Patrol as "contraband" that must be destroyed under state law because of VIN plate discrepancies?

Well, good news may be on the way for the man who owns that vehicle, if a bill approved Monday by the Kansas House winds up becoming law.

The current law requires a vehicle or trailer with a "destroyed, removed, altered, or defaced" VIN to be seized and destroyed, but the new bill would create an exemption for vehicles at least 35 years old that are being repaired or restored.

If the bill passes, that would certainly be music to the ears of Richard Martinez, who bought a restored 1959 Corvette for \$50,000 from an Indiana dealer in 2016, only to have his dream car seized when a Kansas state trooper discovered a problem with its VIN during a mandatory registration inspection.

While lawmen eventually determined Martinez was an "innocent owner," they said under Kansas law, the Corvette still had to be seized and crushed. He filed suit in Johnson County District Court, but no decision has been handed down five years later, though a conference proceeding is slated in court for next week. House Bill 2594, if approved, would exempt classic vehicles being repaired or restored and would also exempt classic car owners who didn't know or had no reason to know their car was stolen.

According to Rep. Leo Delperdang, it can sometimes look like something is wrong with the VIN because classic cars often require repairs to areas that house VIN plates.

"I don't blame the Kansas Highway Patrol with what they're doing in this case," Delperdang told his House colleagues. "They're doing their job. I blame the rule makers. That's us in this room. We have the ability to do something for the better moving forward."

However, the leader of the Kansas Highway Patrol, Col. Herman Jones, opposes the bill as written, pointing out that current law already allows removal of a VIN plate without threat of seizure, as long as troopers are present to document the removal and reinstallation processes. He suggested the new House bill be amended to add a provision requiring KHP inspection before the removal of a VIN plate.

"This would allow us to document the vehicle's identity and the removal process, thus protecting innocent citizens of Kansas from fraud, while still holding those accountable who traffic in stolen vehicles," he said.

Meanwhile, the leader of the Kansas Justice Institute believes the seizure of Martinez' Corvette violates the state and federal constitutions because an innocent person's property is being taken without due process.

"Innocence matters," Sam MacRoberts said in a brief submitted to the Johnson County District Court. "The government should not get to destroy Mr. Martinez' car for a wrong he did not commit. That is unconstitutional."

Chevrolet Recalls 22 C8 Corvettes for Faulty Axles



- Chevrolet is recalling examples of 2021 and 2022 Corvettes due to possible axle failure.
- The rear-drive axles *might not have* all of their respective ball bearings, which could result in the loss of drive power.
- The numbers for this recall fall under: NHTSA 22V091000 and General Motors N212351320.

The latest generation of <u>Chevrolet's Corvette is probably the best 'Vette</u> to leave the factory, but even the best can have some faults. <u>Chevrolet</u> is recalling 22 <u>Corvettes</u> because of improperly manufactured rear axles.

According to the recall notice, <u>the rear axle shafts could be missing bearings in the</u> <u>assembly</u>. These missing bearings could result in the axle shaft failing, which could result in the loss of drive power.

If you're looking at your Corvette and are upset, remember this is just, apparently, 22 examples. This recall only affects certain numbers of 2021 and 2022 Chevrolet Corvettes, which means earlier examples should be in the clear.

Statistically speaking, *your* 'Vette probably isn't in the mix, but you can know for certain if you head to the <u>Chevrolet recall portal</u>.

Two States Now Testing Traffic Cameras with Microphones to Automatically Ticket Loud Vehicles

If you own a Corvette and just upgraded your exhaust system with a slick-sounding aftermarket unit, you might want to avoid driving through New York City or Knoxville, Tennessee.

Those two cities have apparently installed fancy new traffic cameras with microphones that can automatically ticket vehicles that violate the city's Noise Code.

Yet another reason, in their eyes, that you should trade your gas-guzzling, emissionemitting car for an electric vehicle that makes no noise at all and will thus save the planet.

According to the <u>Lowered Congress Facebook page</u>, New York's Department of Environmental Protection recently issued a ticket to a BMW M3 owner after the car was caught exceeding the maximum decibel level by one of the city's new-fangled traffic cameras that can automatically measure decibel levels near the road.

Motor Trend reports that more of these "noise cameras" can be expected in other cities across the nation, making us glad we live in a small town that hopefully can't ever afford such contraptions.

That BMW M3 owner, by the way, was told to have the allegedly non-compliant muffler repaired or replaced, then have it inspected at a Department of Environmental Protection location. If the person fails to do so, a fine of at least \$875 is threatened, with other charges also possible.

The letter to the BMW owner includes this explanation:

"[Y]our vehicle has been identified as having a muffler that is not in compliance with Section 386 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, which prohibits excessive noise from motor vehicles. Your vehicle was recorded by a camera that takes a picture of the vehicle and the license plate. In addition, a sound meter records the decibel level as the vehicle approaches and passes the camera."



The New York City camera is part of a larger pilot program that will be evaluated after a trial run from September 2021 to June 30, 2022.

Unfortunately, for car enthusiasts like us, this lunacy is not limited to the Big Apple, which needs to be worrying about other more serious crimes like murder.

Unfortunately, even a small city in the South, Knoxville, Tennessee, is running a similar program using the same "noise cameras" from United Kingdom manufacturer Intelligent Instruments Ltd.

Motor Trend says Knoxville's trial run "is designed to record all vehicle data when the camera is triggered, including audio levels as the car passes by, and then the vehicle data is uploaded to a server where an actual human technician then decides to proceed with issuing a ticket or not."

I don't know about you, but I just see this program as yet another way for Big Brother to stick his nose into a place where it doesn't belong.

Corvette Powered



What does it mean to be "Corvette Powered"?

It's winning your class at the 24 Hours of Le Mans and finishing 9th overall in 1965, cruising over the waves at 60+ mph in the late 1990s and early 2000s, winning the country's most prestigious automotive award concerning custom and hot rod car owners and builders – the Ridler Award, and it ALWAYS means that there is a Corvette engine involved! Visitors to the National Corvette Museum can now step into an exciting exhibit, *Corvette Powered*, that showcases vehicles, specifically mid-century non-General Motors/non-Corvette vehicles, that utilized Corvette engines, and drivelines.

At a time when America's automotive industry was lacking, the small-block Chevy V8 engine changed everything. It was quickly discovered that other engines could not compete with Chevrolet's engineering of the Corvette engine. As a result, some manufacturers, rather than developing their engines, approached Chevrolet and purchased Corvette engines or drivelines for their cars.

As Ed Cole once said, "when the 1955 Chevrolet engine was in the design stage, we were aware of its potential as the hot-rod-able V8. We wanted a high-performance V8, and we achieved our objective."

The use of Chevy's small-block was used in European and American sports cars to boats showcasing that the Corvette engine has powered more than just Corvettes over time. As explained by Director of Collections/Curator, Derek E. Moore, "this exhibit shares a piece of Corvette history and explores the stories of unique vehicles and their use of Corvette engines." Vehicles to see in the exhibit include a 1958 Scarab, 1967 Bizzarrini Strada, 1965 Impala built by Chip Foose, a 1966 Excalibur, 1969 Mangusta, 1977 Avanti II, and more.

The new *Corvette Powered* exhibit explores select stories and the reason they chose Corvette engines to power their vehicles. Stories from Italy to America, Wisconsin to California, and from paved roads to glass-smooth lakes will grace the Exhibit Hall at the Museum until Bash of 2022.
