A Day at NCRS Top Flight Judging

During Carlisle 2021 Sue Wadyka checked at the NCRS tent to get information on qualifying for a Top Flight award for her 2004 Z06. She was told the first thing she should do is purchase the manual entitled, National Corvette Restorers Society 2003-2004 1st Edition Corvette Technical Information Manual and Judging Guide. The next time I saw Sue she asked if I would be interested in having my 2004 Coupe judged as well and I was interested but had some questions, so she told me to purchase the same judging manual. Eventually Sue mentioned the idea to some other members of Club Corvette and Dennis White followed through and purchased the same manual for his 2003 Anniversary Corvette.

At this point I should tell you a little about NCRS and this idea of judging for a Top Flight award. The National Corvette Restorers Society has "the most comprehensive and precise judging system in the automotive hobby". They are privy to much information from GM and specifically Chevrolet regarding Corvettes. The members of NCRS have spent many hours researching and gathering information for the purpose of judging Corvettes for originality and I believe they may have been the originators of the statement Numbers Matching meaning the checking of part numbers on a vehicle to see if they are original to the vehicle. As Sue, Dennis and I found out detail is very important. Cleanliness of your vehicle is important but of most importance is the originality, correctness and function of all parts and systems of the car and whether all the proper parts are present and in the correct location.

Sue, Dennis and I decided to have our cars judged so we joined both the local and national NCRS groups. I was surprised to find out that the local group, NCRS Northeast Regional is in CT and its chairman is Joe Santiso a member of CCC whom Sue and I have known for years. As I found out Joe was very helpful in leading us through the process which is fairly extensive if you prepare your car as suggested in the judging guide. We emailed and called each other over the winter and early spring months comparing notes and asking questions some of which we referred to Joe. In the process we purchased some parts, most definitely learned more about our cars and got to know each other better. It is true that working as a team is much better than working alone and I could not have found better people to carry me through this process.

After applying to have our cars judged each of us received an email congratulating us for acceptance. The judging date was Saturday, June 18, 2022. We met at a parking lot off Rt. 34 in Sandy Hook, CT and cruised to the judging location in Brookfield, CT and a facility owned by a private party who allows NCRS Northeast to use his building and grounds as needed. There were approximately 10-12 other Corvettes being judged this day. Before the judging started, we were each given an envelope containing the 5 category judging sheets which were made out for our individual cars. There were 5 teams of 2 judges each so ultimately 10 judges checked out each car. The 5 categories included, Exterior, Interior, Mechanical, Operations and Chassis. Each judging team took approximately 45 minutes to do its work. We were provided coffee and donuts in the morning and Jersey Mikes sandwiches and soft drinks for lunch. Once the judging was

completed, we waited for the results which actually came sooner than expected. We were asked to come into the building for the presentation. On Friday the judges also did

approximately 14 cars which were owned by two Corvette dealers. You see, attaining a Top Flight Award may actually increase the value of your car. Including the cars from Friday most cars judged received the Top Fight Award. Other awards included 2nd Flight, Women's Choice Award and Sportsman's Award. All cars judged received a ribbon. The judging sheets will be sent to NCRS for review and certification at which time each of us will receive a numbered certificate verifying the award. At this point we can go further with NCRS by having our cars judged regionally and nationally. As members we can also attend and participate in other events including the national convention. It is a great way to meet other people in the hobby and expand your knowledge as well.

Crystal Ridge Winery June 2022


The weather on Friday June 24th was absolutely perfect for a Corvette get together of friends. 53 members from Club Corvette of Ct met at The Crystal Ridge Winery in South Glastonbury for an afternoon and evening of good conversation, great wine, and a lot of laughs. The winery provided "Corvette only" parking to protect our cars from the perils of a parking lot and we had exclusive use of their deck along with café' tables and umbrellas. Our members are known for their generosity and whenever food is involved there is always more than enough to share with fellow club members. At this particular event we chose to set up a "sharing table" for that purpose and the response was fantastic. We filled 3 tables with an abundance of food for all to enjoy and the winery had an expansive selection of wine, beer, and hard cider to satisfy anyone's choice of beverages.

Tom Mannello, a childhood friend of mine, is the winemaker and Crystal Ridge, and several of the wines produced have been voted the best wines in Connecticut for 4 years in a row. Tom is a 4th generation winemaker in his family and he and his brother John also make makes a and bottle their own wines for personal use. After becoming a pilot in the Air Force, Tom became a commercial pilot until his retirement and then turned follow his passion of wine making and became a winemaker first and Chamard Vineyards in Clinton and later at Crystal Ridge. Most of the grapes are grown on the 250-acre vineyard with a few purchased in California for certain wines where it is not practical to grow those grapes locally. Wine tastings at Crystal Ridge are normally conducted by an expert sommelier but she was off and attending a wedding that Friday so Tom was happy to join us and conduct the wine tastings for those interested. I have attended many wine tastings in the past, but having the actual winemaker conduct it gave us an expert insight to each of the wines sampled and Tom brought the "best of the best" for our event.

The ideal weather allowed us to reconnect with so many club friends that Covid separated us from for the past 2 years. While the winery closes at 8:00 pm, they allowed us to extend our day until well after 9:30 and enjoy a bit more wine and the panoramic sunsetting view of the Connecticut valley.

2022 JDRF Rallye for a Cure

Each year the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation holds fund raising road rallye to raise money to fund the foundation's efforts to find a cure for Type 1 diabetes that effects children. Diabetes can strike at any age, but when it happens to children, it has its own set problems, and solutions. JDRF is a non-profit organization and JDRF works tirelessly to find better treatments, preventions and ultimately, a cure for type 1 diabetes (T1D) and its complications through critical research.

This is our 3rd year of attending the Rallye as members of CCC, and each year the number of Club participants grows with 11 cars attending this year. The Rallye begins at New Country BMW with a collection of everyone's favorite ride, whether it be a vintage MG, McLaren, Corvette, or VW Bug, to receive their rallye instructions, a host of snacks and refreshments, and the opportunity to meet other supporters of this effort. Each participant can choose either the 'rallye' route with a list of clues on reaching the destination as quickly and by driving the fewest miles, or just take the 'scenic' route as I did and enjoy the ride. Ultimately, we all ended up at a race track, last year it was Palmer Motorsport Park in Palmer Ma, and this year it was Thompson Motor Speedway in Thompson Ct. After a nice buffet lunch, it's time for some laps on the track.

Thompson Motor Speedway opened in 1940 two years after the hurricane of 1938 leveling everything in its path including a farm owned by John Hoenig. John chose not to rebuild his farm and instead brought in a rock crusher, built a sawmill, and moved thousands of cubic yards of gravel, all of which were needed to create his dream. Before long, the nation's first asphalt racetrack was beginning to take shape and John Hoenig's dream was coming true, a .625-mile, high-banked racetrack was being built.

The road course is 1.7 miles long and has 11 turns and also boasts a skid pad and drifting course. A pace car lead the group at a brisk pace, and with no passing allowed, you were somewhat at the mercy of the car ahead of you as to how fast you would travel on the course. I was fortunate enough to be behind a BMW whose driver was obviously no stranger to a race track knowing the optimal entrance and exit point to each curve and I was a distant image in his rear-view mirror as he exited each curve. Once we hit the straight aways his mirror image changed drastically as I could catch him easily only to be left in the dust at the next set of curves. Total track time was approximately 13 minutes and a great experience for a novice like myself.

Chevy has sold more Corvettes Then Camaros so far in 2022

While the future looks brighter than ever for the mid-engine Corvette, the same sadly can't be said for its little brother, the Camaro.

In fact, the Corvette has outsold the much-less-expensive Camaro for the first two quarters of 2022 – and by a large margin, too.

After selling 8,811 Stingrays from January to March, Chevy followed that up with another 8,630 Corvettes from April to June. During the same two quarters, on the other hand, 6,710 Camaros were built in the first quarter, with that number falling to 4,545 in the second quarter.

That means so far 17,441 Corvettes have been sold to 11,255 Camaros.

The 2022 domination by Corvette follows a similar pattern in 2021 when Stingray sales totaled 14,582 for the first half of the year against 9,881 for the Camaro.

Of course, the 2021 numbers were affected by the chip shortage, with Chevy diverting more chips to the more profitable and already sold Corvettes and idling Camaro production for much of the year.

Rumor has it that the 2024 model year will mark the end of the road for the Camaro as Chevy turns to an electric future. We definitely hate to see it go!



Viva La Corvette

As Corvette Racing has just concluded their final race as an all professional factory effort at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, we thought we would spotlight an artifact in our collection that celebrates the very first win at that historic race for the Pratt & Miller era of Corvette Racing.

In 1996, the Corvette Racing project began with the blessing of John Middlebrook, General Manager of Chevrolet, and Herb Fishel, Director of GM Motorsports. Program Manager, Doug Fehan, connected with Gary Pratt and Jim Miller, who would build their race car based on the all-new C5 Corvette. With driver Ron Fellows testing it, they would continue to develop the C5-R until 1999 when they would begin racing in the new American Le Mans Series. Gary

Claudio, Corvette Marketing Manager, was ready to make sure everyone in the world would take notice.

In 2001, with only two seasons behind them, the two-car Corvette Racing team took the overall win at the 24 Hours of Daytona in the #2 Corvette driven by Ron Fellows, Johnny O'Connell, and Chris Kneifel. The #3 Corvette came in second in class and was famously driven by Dale Earnhardt, Dale Jr., Andy Pilgrim and Kelly Collins. Inspired by Dale, who would tragically lose his life on that same track not long afterwards, Corvette Racing crossed the ocean to race at the 24 Hours of Le Mans. They faced incredible adversity, but at the end of the 24-hour battle, they stood victorious on the podium with the first and second place trophies.

Gary Claudio remembers that moment vividly. "I recall standing on the podium looking down at this crowd, this ocean of people, as our National Anthem was played. They were all celebrating with us. They had adopted us. We had come hat in hand, humble, honoring the tradition of Le Mans, and they had accepted us. They loved the sound of that ground-pounding-American thunder and would flock to the fence when our cars would go down the Mulsanne Straight. Watching them now chant "Viva La Corvette" was a profound moment for all of us. We set out to compete internationally and represent GM, the Corvette, and the loyal patrons who loved and drove these cars, and we had won. We made history that day and would go on to do it seven more times."

Designed to commemorate this win, this Le Mans ring was donated to the National Corvette Museum by Mr. Claudio, as he saw this as the place for it. "It represents the hard work of the team, the sweat, the blood, the dedication, the passion, and the love that is best summed up in one word… Corvette."






