## Open Letter to Car Show Participants



Dear Corvette Enthusiast,

First and foremost, we hope everything is well with you and your family as we are hopefully nearing the end of this COVID pandemic. .... It has been a busy and trying time which has resulted in several changes to our car show this year. The biggest news is that we have changed to a new time of year and moved to a new location. Club Corvette of Connecticut's **28**<sup>th</sup> **Corvette Show & Swap** 

**Meet** will be **Sunday, October 2**<sup>nd</sup>. We listened to feedback from the show participants and our club members and the two most mentioned issues were the July heat and summer traffic after the show. We polled our membership and decided a fall date would be a good solution to both issues.

Another issue we had to address is that simply we ran out of room for parking spectator cars at the Moroso facility. We are happy to report that Moroso is still one of our club sponsors, but we decided to relocate this year's car show to the Guilford Fairgrounds. The Fairgrounds are located 1.5 miles from Moroso. You will still get off the highway at the same exit off Interstate 95, Exit 59 (Goose Lane) in Guilford, CT. The new location will allow to us to expand the show as there is ample area for parking as well as room to expand the vendor swap meet area. Unfortunately, we are not able to reserve a rain date at this location, so the show will be rain or shine.

One significant change that will take place this year is that we have reduced the number of judged classes. We struggled in the last couple of shows to have an adequate number of judges to be able to judge all the cars in a timely manner. This seems to be a global issue as the number of judged Corvette shows has dwindled to just a few in recent years. A decision was made to start the judging earlier (11:00 am vs 12:00 noon) and to limit the judging to just the cars in the Show classes. There will be 16 Show classes for C1 through C8 coupe & roadsters along with a class for modified Corvettes. Participants will have their choice of entering the judged classes or parking in the new Fun Field which will have trophies awarded by celebrity judges to each of the eight Corvette generations. Entry fee for the judged classes will be \$25, while the Fun Field will be \$20. All entries will receive an event T-shirt.

We are happy to announce that this year's celebrity judge with be Kevin MacKay. Kevin is well known throughout the Corvette community as the 'Corvette Hunter' having been the person that tracked down the famous #3 Cunningham Corvette that won its' class at the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 1960 driven by John Fitch and Bob Grossman. Kevin is the owner of Corvette Repair in Valley Stream, NY. We are in contact with a couple of other celebrity judges, but have not confirmed they will be available as yet.

In closing, please help us make this a fun filled Corvette day. Please tell all your friends and family about our show as we expect to have approximately 200 Corvette entered in the show as well as over 100 Club Corvette of CT member's Corvettes on display and a spectator Corvette corral. General public admission is \$5.00 per person; children under 12 are admitted free. We would appreciate it if you could post the enclosed flyer anywhere in your local area. All the profits from the show benefit Club Corvette of CT's adopted charity, The Ronald McDonald House of New Haven, CT. This is a great cause that we want to do our best to raise as much money as possible to support.

With that in mind, I went to work planning a route to Narragansett, RI for the Corvette Club of Rhode Island (CCRI) 50<sup>th</sup> Corvettes By the Sea Car Show to be held on Sunday, August 14<sup>th</sup>. I looked at the route that CCRI had included with their flyer and quickly decided that I could do better. Using my maps app and looking at Google Earth I found the perfect route. # **Sights from Corvettes by the Sea**



## 2022 Lime Rock Historic Festival

Labor Day weekend is always a big weekend at Lime Rock Park and this year was no exception. 2022 celebrated the 40<sup>th</sup> year of the Historic Festival and the upcoming 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Corvette. It was in January at the GM Motorama that the futuristic Corvette was introduced to America. No one could have imagined at that time how iconic that marque would become for the next 70 years and beyond.

This year's festival was graced by an abundance of glorious racers from by gone eras featuring such classics as a 1929 Stutz, and when the owner was asked why he was here, he said "to race, of course". Other vintage classics on display was a 1929 Bugatti and a 1951 Morgan Plus 4. There were four days racing, starting with the vintage racers qualifications and racing and the "Gathering of the Marques car show on Sunday. This gathering included over 1000 automobiles and motorcycles and was divided into show cars, concours cars, concepts, and racers with Corvettes and Porsches dominating the displays. On hand to help celebrate Corvettes' upcoming 70th anniversary were several General Motors executives who were instrumental in the development of the C4 and C5 Corvettes.

Three of these engineers along with our Club's own Ray Zisa, toured the display area and judged the Corvettes in the Concours class and presented awards to many of the owners. The blue- ribbon winner of the day was an absolutely magnificently restored fuel injected

1963 Corvette Z06, one of only 199 of these 'race ready' Corvettes produced in 1963 and one of only 63 equipped with the large capacity fuel tank. This exceptionally rare Z06 was originally purchased and remained in Connecticut until it was sold and restored several years ago.

# Ladies CAN have fun at Carlisle "I did"

I was so excited to see our club tent was located on

Barbie Boulevard.

This was my 2<sup>nd</sup> adventure to Carlisle.....and ladies let me tell you, there is shopping. Maybe not enough for days, but there is also food, socializing, AND ice cream. What else do you need?

I spent my Carlisle adventure with Ann, Chris, Gail, and Sue, and for one day, Joyce, Judy, and Rhonda.

These are the treasures I found:

1. <u>Bracelet:</u> A one-of-a-kind silver bracelet with an insert made from layers of 'overspray' from the paint room at Bowling Green. The artist 'slices' the mounds of overspray, and creates art.





- 2. <u>Sunglasses:</u> I hate losing a good pair of sunglasses, so I bought two for \$ 20.00 and got one free. Rick got the better deal, he bought one pair for \$ 20.00 and got two free. Still, they were cheap, and I won't care if I lose them.
- 3. <u>Conch Shell:</u> Carved from Ironwood (a very dense and heavy wood). The technique was originated by Seri Indians, a small tribe that have dwelled in the great Sonoran Desert.



4. <u>Wind Restrictor</u>: This is like 'bling' for your convertible. It is a plastic piece that fits behind the seats to restrict the wind. It is laser-etched (the word 'Corvette' and the C-5 flags) and can be illuminated (with five different colors, Ruby, Garnet, Emerald, Topaz, and Sapphire). 




