Wreaths Across America 2023



The First National Wreaths Across America Day

The first National Wreaths Across America Day was held on December 13th, 2008. That year, volunteers laid 2,221 wreaths at Arlington National Cemetery and over 2.7 million in 4000 cemeteries throughout the country. The military community has Morrill Worcester, the owner of Worcester Wreath Company in Harrington, Maine to thank for the event that has become a national movement.

On Saturday, millions of Americans remembered the nation's fallen, honoring the men and women who have served by placing fresh greens on millions of graves as part of National Wreaths Across America Day 2023. Volunteers laid wreaths on gravesites at 4,225 participating locations across the country, saying the names of the service members aloud.

Members of Club Corvette of Connecticut participated in honoring veterans at the East Lawn Cemetery in East Haven Ct. Jack Stacey hosted the memorial service at the East Haven Veterans Memorial on the Green. Escorting veterans and representing the branch of the service where they served were Frank Bugaj, Air Force and Dennis Krajewski, Navy. Following the memorial service, members then placed over 100 wreaths on the graves for veterans.

Honoring the men and women who have served our country is a very humbling and somber experience. This special day of remembrance is made possible by Wreaths Across America partners, volunteers, drivers, and supporters. Each wreath is hand-crafted of all-American balsam and hand-tied with a red velvet bow in Columbia Falls, Maine. Wreaths are sent to participating locations where volunteers place them on markers of fallen heroes.

Remembering those Days???

I'm into my 5th year of retirement and more than six decades past grammar school. (Is it still called grammar school? ... With the way kids speak today... Wouldn't that be an oxymoron?) ... Holy cow, One sentence in and I'm already drifting off topic, I apologize. ANYWAY, remember when you'd come back from one of those holiday breaks and the teacher would have you write a few paragraphs of what you did during your time off and then had you read it to the entire class, who were, either bored OR frightened about when it was going to be their turn in the barrel.

Well anyway that was my thought as I was finishing up a very quick but kinda important maintenance chore on my unicorn. Maybe you remember me writing about the C7 DSOM Z06 we bought back in September. Well, we got her with a little more than 25K miles and we just passed 29K and the maintenance manual recommends that the Differential fluid be changed anyway between 30K and 60K. Soooo, I had nothing but time on my hands and I thought I'd give it a shot...What could go wrong, RIGHT?

JUST FYI, the differential fluid is totally different than the eLSD fluid, So please don't get confused. When I say Differential fluid, I'm talking about what we used to call the 'Banjo' area back in the olden days if you ever were a gear head. It's where the axels meet the ring and pinion gears.

So with the car suspended on all four corners on Jack Stands and off the ground about 18 inches, I crawl under her, fully outfitted with an empty container able to hold at least the 3 qt of drained fluid, a 3/8 ratchet, 2 short extensions for said ratchet, a drop light and a pair of latex gloves and a handful of rags because I was bound and determined that nothing was going to go wrong... The way I was prepared, What could go wrong...RIGHT???

But honestly, it didn't take 90 minutes start to finish but what a "Keystone Cops" 90 minutes it was. I accredit it to my tranquil and quiet disposition and ability to 'plan ahead'. Ideally it should go something like this:

1. Locate the 'FILL' and 'DRAIN' plugs just passed the mufflers and sway bar...Here they are.


FILL PLUG:

(remove <u>first</u> by just inserting the 3/8 ratchet and short extension. Very little effort is needed because the torque spec is only 20 lb.-ft)



DRAIN PLUG:

(remove only when you are sure you had the container properly located... I didn't and it made quite a mess, but if that's the only thing that might have gone wrong... No Big Deal... right?)



They are "plastic-y" with a magnetic insert and as soon as I had them in my hand, I was glad I took on this chore. This is what mine looked like... Yep...That's tiny metal filings:



 GM recommends DEXRON LS Gear oil PN 88862624 (75w-90), but I'm partial to AMSOIL so I used this stuff: AMSOIL Severe Gear oil SAE 75W-90, Contains friction modifiers for limited-slip applications



The squeeze bottle design makes it a snap to fill the differential reservoir in a confined space instead of pumping it from a qt bottle. Squeeze 3 qts. in and you're done... install the plugs and torque to 20 lb-ft.

So, what could have gone wrong?

- Well, I would Definitely have started with more rags. Which would have eliminated 2 trips crawling out from under the car.
- I would have held onto the plugs more firmly instead of dropping them into the used oil. This would have eliminated another trip crawling out from under the car.
- Starting with a ratchet on a swivel, would have been nice, instead of crawling out AGAIN to go find one.
- I wouldn't have put the empty squeeze bottle directly behind my head cuz there's always a little bit left in it... If you can remember 'The Little Rascals", think of Alfalfa.
- AND.... I definitely would not have let Barb see me before I washed my hair.
- Other than that...it was a piece of cake and a job worth doing.

Maybe next fall when we return from the Caravan, I'll tackle the automatic transmission fluid...After all.... Say it with me..." What could go wrong" Here's an excellent write up in Corvette Forum if anyone is interested:

Donated Die Cast Collection

Charles Porter was a Corvette enthusiast owning many over his lifetime, an avid collector of die cast models he also enjoyed riding his Harley Davidson Triglide with his wife Jean. The majority of his die cast collection is Franklin Mint 1/24 scale models plus a collection of AMT - ERTL plastic promotional models used to showcase upcoming cars, colors and models that would be available to car dealers. When Charles passed away last February Jean was tasked with deciding what to do with this extensive collection as she prepared to move out of state to live with her daughter. Ultimately, she was referred to me by Ray Zisa from The Corvette Center with how best to liquidate this collection. Jean is a person that you like a minute or so after you have met her, friendly, down to earth, and a very caring partner to Charlie. After explaining the complexity of attempting to determine the value of the collection, I suggested that she donate them to Club Corvette of Connecticut and that we would find an owner that would value each die cast just as Charlie did. She was thrilled when I told Jean that the proceeds would all be donated to The Ronald McDonald House of Connecticut - an organization that she and Charlie were very familiar with and had supported themselves. To say that the collection is extensive is an understatement, all of which are in the original Styrofoam molded package, and many of which have never been opened.

Charlie's collection of 50+ cars is heavily dominated by C1 and C2 models of every color and each in pristine condition. While the collection consists primarily of Corvettes, it also contained a few other classics such as a 1977 Boss 302 Mustang, a 1977 Firebird Trans Am, a 1965 Shelby GT 350 with its own show case, and a collection of Christmas pick-up trucks. After opening each box and cataloging the model, color, and year of each car I began offering these for sale to our membership. Each car purchased to date has been unique and no doubt special in one way or another to the member, something that I think would make Charlie very happy, and Jean very pleased with how we are passing down his prized collection to others.

We have collected over \$1300.00 for Ronald McDonald House so far from the sale of the cars & trucks, and will add it to our donation that will be presented to Ronald McDonald House at our Korvettes for Kids toy drive on December 3rd. There are no price tags on any of the cars, I ask only that you decide how much to pay and this will become part of our donation to RMH. Once again, our members show their generosity in making their donations and helping others in need.

Lucy and I recently visited Jean as we knew that her move date was approaching and committed to keeping her updated on our progress of placing these cars with new owners. As we sat outside chatting on her deck, we found out that Lucy & I share the same wedding date as Jean and Charlie. Jean is a wonderful person, I regret that I never had the privilege of meeting Charlie Porter, I know that I would have liked him very much as well.

Corvette Racing Wins 2023 World Endurance Champion Season



Despite facing weight and power limitations, the GTE-spec C8.R Corvette finished seventh in Bahrain, yet emerged victorious in the WEC team championship. The 2023 FIA World Endurance Championship for Corvette Racing culminated with an eight-hour race in Bahrain, following remarkable triumphs at Sebring, Portimao, Le Mans, and a second-place finish at Spa, securing the GTE Am driver and team titles by July 9 at Monza. The final Bahrain race had no bearing on the championship, but the team aimed for a strong finish nonetheless. The Corvette carried an extra 77 pounds due to its stellar season, accumulating weight penalties based on prior race performance.

Additionally, a reduction in engine restrictor size lowered power output by about 10 horsepower, further challenging its performance, despite already competing with less horsepower than its GTE Am counterparts throughout the year.



Artifact of the Month Corvette Christmas Tree Oraments



For 70 years, Corvette has represented speed, style, and personal expression. It's no surprise that when you add in a little holiday flair, Corvettes become a natural inspiration for Christmas decorations. This month, we share four Corvette-themed Christmas tree ornaments from the George Biederman Collection.

In the first example, Santa Claus has traded in his sleigh for a 1953 Corvette, complete with gifts in the passenger seat and a big green bow around the middle. This ornament was created by the ENESCO Corporation in honor of Corvette's 40th anniversary in 1993. Named "Dream Wheels" by ENESCO, it was part of a larger series of holiday ornaments based on reverent, nostalgic, and even humorous themes. Although there are plenty of ornaments featuring Santa at the wheel of a Corvette, this version was sold for one year only.

During Corvette's 50th anniversary in 2003, another iconic design inspired this ornament by Hallmark. Buyers could adorn their Christmas trees with the 1963 Sting Ray splitwindow coupe. Based on a sculpture by artist Don Palmiter, this ornament captures the '63 Sting Ray's sleek and smooth styling. Finished in Sebring Silver, the decoration is similar to the real-life example on display at the National Corvette Museum. Note the wrapped presents visible through the split window.

A second ornament by Hallmark honors a toy that has appeared under many Christmas trees. Released in 2008, the ornament celebrates Barbie's 1976 Star 'Vette, the first Corvette toy created for Mattel's famous fashion doll. The original Star 'Vette was a deep pink C3 that came with a set of star decals. The ornament features all the details of the toy including the luggage rack, "Super Slicks" tires, and Barbie herself in the driver's seat. This tribute to the Star 'Vette shows how timeless both Barbie and the Corvette have become.

One final ornament from Hallmark is from 1997, modeling the then-new C5 Corvette. For this design, again created by Don Palmiter, the focus is on realism. The ornament depicts a stylish Torch Red Corvette just as it would have appeared on the showroom floor. Like Palmiter's '63 Sting Ray ornament, this Corvette also holds wrapped presents visible through the back window, adding some holiday spirit to America's Sports Car.
