

### **Donated Die Cast Collection**

Charles Porter was a Corvette enthusiast owning many over his lifetime, an avid collector of die cast models he also enjoyed riding his Harley Davidson Triglide with his wife Jean. The majority of his die cast collection is Franklin Mint 1/24 scale models plus a collection of AMT – ERTL plastic promotional models used to showcase upcoming cars, colors and models that would be available to car dealers. When Charles passed away last February Jean was tasked with deciding what to do with this extensive collection as she prepared to move out of state to live with her daughter. Ultimately, she was referred to me by Ray Zisa from The Corvette Center with how best to liquidate this collection. Jean is a person that you like a minute or so after you have met her, friendly, down to earth, and a very caring partner to Charlie. After explaining the complexity of attempting to determine the value of the collection, I suggested that she donate them to Club Corvette of Connecticut and that we would find an owner that would value each die cast just as Charlie did. She was thrilled when I told Jean that the proceeds would all be donated to The Ronald McDonald House of Connecticut - an organization that she and Charlie were very familiar with and had supported themselves. To say that the collection is extensive is an understatement, all of which are in the original Styrofoam molded package, and many of which have never been opened.

Charlie's collection of 50+ cars is heavily dominated by C1 and C2 models of every color and each in pristine condition. While the collection consists primarily of Corvettes, it also contained a few other classics such as a 1977 Boss 302 Mustang, a 1977 Firebird Trans Am, a 1965 Shelby GT 350 with its own show case, and a collection of Christmas pickup trucks. After opening each box and cataloging the model, color, and year of each car I began offering these for sale to our membership. Each car purchased to date has been unique and no doubt special in one way or another to the member, something that I think would make Charlie very happy, and Jean very pleased with how we are passing down his prized collection to others.

We have collected over \$1300.00 for Ronald McDonald House so far from the sale of the cars & trucks, and will add it to our donation that will be presented to Ronald McDonald House at our Korvettes for Kids toy drive on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. There are no price tags on any of the cars, I ask only that you decide how much to pay and this will become part of our donation to RMH. Once again, our members show their generosity in making their donations and helping others in need.

Lucy and I recently visited Jean as we knew that her move date was approaching and committed to keeping her updated on our progress of placing these cars with new owners. As we sat outside chatting on her deck, we found out that Lucy & I share the same wedding date as Jean and Charlie. Jean is a wonderful person, I regret that I never had the privilege of meeting Charlie Porter, I know that I would have liked him very much as well.

### How to Use Android Auto or Apple Car

If your car doesn't have an infotainment system, Or you don't want to be bothered with *Android Auto* or *Apple Car Play*, Don't bother reading any further, this article isn't for you, BUT if you **are** interested in either of those 2 APPS, stick around... this may be of interest.

### First what are those APPS?... well Look for these icons

### Android Auto

Apple Car Play



You even might have seen these Icons on your infotainment system, but weren't aware just how useful they can be.

Android Auto and Apple Car Play are what they call <u>in the trades</u>, `a smart driving companion'. They are simple and easy ways to use most of the convenient apps on your phone but have them POP up and be used on the car's infotainment system. They can route to your next destination using your favorite mapping program. You can listen to your favorite Music service, such as Pandora, Spotify or Podcasts. AND... If you're really daring.... You can use their Voice Activated Controls. For something VERY useful, for example you can Say..."Ok Google, find me the nearest ice cream parlor"! or you can verbally use it to call someone in your contact list without taking your eyes off the road.

### How can I connect my cell phone to either of these APPS?

And if you haven't figured it out yet... *Apple Car Play* is only for you iPhone users and (you got it)... *Android Auto* are for you Android users. To link your cell phone to the appropriate app, all that's necessary is to connect your cell to the car's USB port with the appropriate cable...It's probably the same one you use to charge the phone with. Once you made the physical connection then find the correct app for your phone on the infotainment system. Then tap it and follow the on-screen instructions. It's that EASY!

### So what happens when you unplug your phone and or you leave the vehicle?

Well then, you will be disconnected from whichever app you were connected to and will have to reconnect **each** time you enter the vehicle.... BUT..., if you've followed along with me so far and or have found this article of any interest...hang with me just a little longer because what comes next is VERY cool and VERY convenient.

There are many aftermarket products that you can connect to any of the USB ports in your vehicle, that will automatically detect your phone the moment you sit down and start your car. . So you might ask,,,"So why's that a big deal?...." WELL.....you can keep the phone in your pocket or purse or backpack and never have to worry that you've left your cell in the car only to find that you're miles away from it. Here is a link to a popular one, but there are many others to choose from,

your phone wirelessly... And YES..it's a tad over the Top and Yes it's not really necessary but it **IS VERY** convenient and pretty cool non the less 😊

### Artifact of the Month Dale Earnhart Jr.'s Autographed Helmet

Held in February each year since 1959, the Daytona 500 is NASCAR's most prestigious race. Wins at Daytona are among the greatest accomplishments in a driver's career, victories that will be remembered for decades. This year marks the 10th anniversary of Dale Earnhardt Jr.'s second Daytona 500 win.


Earnhardt Jr. won his first Daytona 500 in 2004, driving for the race team founded by his legendary father. Four years later, he began racing for Hendrick Motorsports, the top Chevrolet team in NASCAR's highest division. In his first six seasons with Hendrick, Earnhardt Jr. won only two races and entered 2014 in a 55-race winless drought. However, Earnhardt Jr. was still regarded as one of the best superspeedway drivers in NASCAR. The Daytona 500 was a great opportunity for him to return to victory lane. D

ue to a rain delay in the early laps, most of the 2014 Daytona 500 was run under the lights. Earnhardt Jr. emerged as a contender late in the race, taking the lead with 18 laps to go. However, while circling the track under caution with four laps left, he hit a large piece of bonding tape that had fallen off a damaged car. The tape got stuck on the grille of his Chevy SS, threatening to overheat the car.

The sticky debris put Earnhardt Jr. and Hendrick Motorsports in a difficult spot. If they went to pit road to remove the tape, they would surrender the lead and never regain their track position. Finishing the race with the tape on the grille and hoping the car would not overheat was their only option. The race ended with a two-lap dash to the finish, and Earnhardt Jr. held the lead the whole way, capturing the victory with the tape still affixed to his car.

Earnhardt Jr. autographed this commemorative helmet, which was generously donated to the National Corvette Museum by Allan DePue. The replica helmet is #153 out of 588 and includes a "Victory Collage" of Earnhardt Jr. and Hendrick Motorsports celebrating their Daytona 500 win. Earnhardt Jr.'s "Dale Junior" signature appears on the helmet's visor in gold script.

The race-winning car is at the Hendrick Motorsports Museum in Charlotte, North Carolina, with the infamous tape still stuck on the grille.



### Celebrating 10 years of progress since the Infamous sinkhole: Ground to Sky: the sinkhole Reimagined.' Opens Friday June 14<sup>th</sup> 2024

**BOWLING GREEN, KY, February 12, 2024** – On February 12, 2014, at 5:38 AM, the National Corvette Museum suffered a cave-in that claimed eight cars from the museum's multimillion dollar collection and caused an international sensation. The video and images captured by museum security cameras went viral, circulating around the globe. Viewers were left stunned at the loss of such rare and remarkable treasures, and all eyes were on the National Corvette Museum's response and recovery.

Today, on the tenth anniversary of the world-famous sinkhole, the National Corvette Museum is celebrating incredible change and growth in the decade since, revealing details on its upcoming exhibit "Ground to Sky: The Sinkhole Reimagined." The exhibit will open to the public on Friday, June 14, 2024, and will run through September 15, 2024. It will document the moments, memories, and machines that made history that fateful day, while focusing on the accomplishments of countless Museum staff and supporters who built back and reimagined a National Corvette Museum that continues to evolve.



"The National Corvette Museum captured the attention of the world a decade ago, and we've spent the last decade turning misfortunes into hard-fought and well-earned triumphs," said Kaye Wagner, National Corvette Museum Board Chair. "With over 15 major exhibitions, tens of millions of dollars in renovations and improvements, the creation of a STEAM-focused education gallery, the addition of a world-class Motorsports Park to our campus, and countless other advances in the last ten years, the National Corvette Museum is proud of our journey. Thanks to our amazing team and supporters, we have survived a sinkhole. Not only have we endured, but we are thriving."

According to Wagner, "Like all museums, the National Corvette Museum rotates artifacts on and off exhibit to rest them and bring in fresh material for our visitors. Those who wish to see the sinkhole artifacts should make definitive plans to visit during the run of "Ground to Sky." Once the exhibit closes, these artifacts will be rotated back into the collection for rest from public view."

The exhibit will feature two Corvettes that were recovered from the sinkhole and fully restored, a 2009 "Blue Devil" ZR1 and the 1 Millionth Corvette (a white '92 model). It will also include other cars that remain damaged from the incident and dramatic multimedia that illustrate a look back at the National Corvette Museum's remarkable history, and a vision of where the Museum is heading.

The National Corvette Museum Board of Directors is actively seeking a new CEO following the departure of Sharon Brawner, who served as president and CEO until earlier this month. In the interim, Bryce Burklow is fulfilling the role of Chief Operating Officer until a permanent successor is appointed.

Kaye Wagner, Chair of the Board, expressed the commitment to advancing the search for new leadership while maintaining the museum's legacy and connections to staff, donors, members, and the Corvette community. In a message to the "members of the Corvette Community," style="display: block; width: 100%; height: 100%" /> Wagner highlighted the museum's achievements, including expanding exhibits, educational programs, enhancing visitor experiences, and hosting memorable events. She credited this progress to the collective efforts of the entire community, including staff, volunteers, donors, members, and Corvette enthusiasts worldwide.

The board, working closely with museum staff, aims to establish criteria for the new CEO that respects the museum's history while aligning with the desires and direction of stakeholders. Wagner encouraged members of the Corvette community to share their thoughts, ideas, and visions for the future of the NCM with board members, recognizing their invaluable input during this transition period.

Expressing gratitude for enthusiasts' support and trust, Wagner expressed optimism for the museum's future milestones. She emphasized the role of the National Corvette Museum as a home for those passionate about Corvettes, affirming the collective commitment to honoring heritage while embracing the future.
