## **Donated Die Cast Collection**

Charles Porter was a Corvette enthusiast owning many over his lifetime, an avid collector of die cast models he also enjoyed riding his Harley Davidson Triglide with his wife Jean. The majority of his die cast collection is Franklin Mint 1/24 scale models plus a collection of AMT – ERTL plastic promotional models used to showcase upcoming cars, colors and models that would be available to car dealers. When Charles passed away last February Jean was tasked with deciding what to do with this extensive collection as she prepared to move out of state to live with her daughter. Ultimately, she was referred to me by Ray Zisa from The Corvette Center with how best to liquidate this collection. Jean is a person that you like a minute or so after you have met her, friendly, down to earth, and a very caring partner to Charlie. After explaining the complexity of attempting to determine the value of the collection, I suggested that she donate them to Club Corvette of Connecticut and that we would find an owner that would value each die cast just as Charlie did. She was thrilled when I told Jean that the proceeds would all be donated to The Ronald McDonald House of Connecticut - an organization that she and Charlie were very familiar with and had supported themselves. To say that the collection is extensive is an understatement, all of which are in the original Styrofoam molded package, and many of which have never been opened.

Charlie's collection of 50+ cars is heavily dominated by C1 and C2 models of every color and each in pristine condition. While the collection consists primarily of Corvettes, it also contained a few other classics such as a 1977 Boss 302 Mustang, a 1977 Firebird Trans Am, a 1965 Shelby GT 350 with its own show case, and a collection of Christmas pickup trucks. After opening each box and cataloging the model, color, and year of each car I began offering these for sale to our membership. Each car purchased to date has been unique and no doubt special in one way or another to the member, something that I think would make Charlie very happy, and Jean very pleased with how we are passing down his prized collection to others.

We have collected over \$1300.00 for Ronald McDonald House so far from the sale of the cars & trucks, and will add it to our donation that will be presented to Ronald McDonald House at our Korvettes for Kids toy drive on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. There are no price tags on any of the cars, I ask only that you decide how much to pay and this will become part of our donation to RMH. Once again, our members show their generosity in making their donations and helping others in need.

Lucy and I recently visited Jean as we knew that her move date was approaching and committed to keeping her updated on our progress of placing these cars with new owners. As we sat outside chatting on her deck, we found out that Lucy & I share the same wedding date as Jean and Charlie. Jean is a wonderful person, I regret that I never had the privilege of meeting Charlie Porter, I know that I would have liked him very much as well.

You're in the middle of a project. Maybe, it's tinkering with your Corvette or your Lawnmower or even finishing up a woodworking project and want to paint it...and you reach for a can of Carb cleaner or Brake Part Cleaner or even a can of Spray paint.



You then push the spray tip and.....NOTHING

So, what do you do? Well, if you're anything like me...The first thing you do... well, the **second** thing you do is shake the can, (use your imagination on that first thing}... Yeap... There's still liquid in there. Next maybe, you try to clean the nozzle only to realize that the can you bought <u>5 years ago</u> has somehow lost all the propellant gas inside. Now what do you do? It'll probably be the same as the FIRST thing from above because now your project has got to be put on hold because a trip to Home Depot or Lowe's is necessary... OR DOES IT HAVE TO BE NECESSARY? Well, if you have an air compressor and one of these



#### I'd like you to try this:



First, pull off the spray tip and insert the compressor gun nozzle. Pull the trigger and wait a few seconds. Just long enough for the compressor to recharge the can and **voilà**, You're back in business. Reinsert the spray tip and go finish that project.

### Artifact of the Month Avanti

In 1963, automobile designer Margaret "Peg" Sauer began a new challenge. Sauer had previously worked for Harley Earl's "Damsels of Design" team at General Motors, where she was influential in creating interiors for several GM vehicles in the 1950s. Her new opportunity came with Raymond Loewy's industrial design studio and a chance to work on its latest project, the Studebaker Avanti. The Avanti was Studebaker's new luxury performance car, and the automobile manufacturer had tasked Loewy's team with its design.

In just 40 days, Lowey's studio crafted a design for a four-seat coupe with a distinct appearance. The Avanti featured an elongated hood and curved rear fenders, which made the car look like a futuristic airplane. Its unusual shape required the body to be molded from fiberglass panels. Since the Avanti lacked a grille across its nose, Loewy's team designed the car as a "bottom breather," with air vents placed underneath the front bumper. Sauer's most notable contribution was a unique glovebox equipped with a pullout drawer. The drawer contained a flip-up mirror and extra storage space for small items. Yet the Avanti's innovative design did not save Studebaker's sagging automobile sales. The company sold fewer than 6,000 Avantis before closing its plant in South Bend, Indiana.

However, the Avanti lived on for several more decades thanks to a series of periodic revivals. The longest-lived of these successor cars were created by former Studebaker dealers Nate and Arnold Altman. The Altman brothers partnered with Leo Newman, who had overseen Studebaker's truck parts division, to form the Avanti Motor Corporation. From 1965 into the 1980s, Newman and the Altman brothers sold a modified version of the Studebaker Avanti, known as the Avanti II. Each Avanti II was custom ordered and hand-built. Buyers could select a variety of color combinations for the exterior and interior, even down to the shag carpet in the trunk. Avanti IIs also used Chevrolet's small-block V8 engine, the same power plant as the Corvette.

The National Corvette Museum's collection includes a 1977 Avanti II donated by Mike Hammer. This car has a gold interior and exterior like a Studebaker Avanti Hammer saw in his youth. It includes a Corvette engine, a fiberglass body, and the special glovebox design created by Sauer more than 60 years ago.

Purchasers located in Kentucky can purchase raffle tickets on their personal computers, mobile devices and on-site at the National Corvette Museum and NCM Motorsports Park.

To purchase a raffle ticket online, you must be at least 18 years of age and be physically located in Kentucky at the time of purchase. You do not have to be a resident of Kentucky to participate.

The payment information will be encrypted for your protection and broken into two parts, some of which will only be on the printed form. You must have access to a printer at the time that you create the order.
