The recent BASH event had surprisingly little news on where Corvette was going in 2026. I was surprised that Tony Roma (the new Jadge Juechter) and Amy Masica (the new Harlan Charles) in their presentation were quiet on the new for 2026 interior changes. I was hoping for at least a picture if not a real X car with the real thing. Nope. We'll have to wait to actually see it up close the new display, new switch panel, new switch locations, the new "no wall" handle, the new phone charger location, and the new cup holders. They talked a lot about the ZR1 obviously and, outside the Museum, they were on display in Hysteria and Competition Yellow. But they did talk about Rapid Blue and Seawolf Gray being discontinued and wait for it, replaced with Roswell Green(aliens anyone?) and the old Blade Silver! They brought a sample of Roswell painted on one of their scale models. What interior will show up for this color is anybody's guess. And why Blade Silver and not bringing back the nicer Silver Flare? Corvette nation apparently loves the flatter looking silver. Who knew? And no talk of the Grand Sport, but it is coming. It appears only wide body Corvette versions are expected to be built going forward???? The Museum had some interesting show and tells. We are now digitizing all the cars in our collection in 3D. I got to see the process being performed on a C4 Callaway. The entire car inside and out!. With the colors correct! You can print the entire car in 3D. The Museum has done 3 cars so far. Very valuable for historical writers/researchers and very valuable for restorers!



Corvette Racing Secures Laguna Seca Podium No. 3 Corvette Z06 GT3.R clinched 3rd place

Corvette Racing powered to a podium finish at the Monterey SportsCar Championship at WeatherTech Raceway Laguna Seca on May 11, 2025, thanks to a strong performance by Antonio Garcia and Alexander Sims in the No. 3 Corvette Z06 GT3.R. The duo clinched third place, marking their second podium in just three GTD PRO races this season.

In a rare flag-to-flag green race with no cautions, strategy and execution were critical. The No. 3 car delivered flawless pit stops and held strong despite a few close encounters while fighting through the pack.

"The Corvette felt great, and the team did a fantastic job," said Sims. "Given the pace, third was where we deserved to be. Pratt Miller had the car dialed in perfectly." said Sims.

This result also marks Corvette Racing's second consecutive podium finish at Laguna Seca, following last year's third-place by Tommy Milner and Nicky Catsburg in the No. 4 Corvette. Unfortunately, the No. 4 entry wasn't as fortunate this time, suffering from a refueling issue that impacted their performance.

Next stop: the Chevrolet Detroit Sports Car Classic, happening May 30–31, 2025. Stay tuned as Corvette Racing continues its charge in the IMSA WeatherTech Championship!



Artifact of the Month Cadillac Dpi-VR race Car and Photos

On November 30, 2016, General Motors unveiled its newest sports prototype race car, the Cadillac DPi-V.R. The 600-horsepower racing machine marked Cadillac's return to prototype racing for the first time since 2002. Some of the car's features include Brembo brakes, performance wheels, and vertical lighting elements—all inspired by Cadillac's line of V-Performance automobiles. The Cadillac DPi-V.R competed in North American endurance racing events from 2017 to 2022. Its successor, the Cadillac V-Series.R, debuted the following season as the brand's next-generation prototype racer. One of the Cadillac DPi race cars is currently on exhibit at the National Corvette Museum, along with a photograph captured by Richard Prince. Prince's photograph features the automobile on display, along with four other Cadillac prototype race cars, on the high banks of Daytona International Speedway in 2022. Prince typically handles preseason photography for Cadillac and Corvette Racing each year before Daytona's 24-hour race in late January. The photograph shows all five cars in motion, moving at speeds around 50–60 miles per hour.

Capturing an image like this one presents significant challenges for a photographer, even one with decades of experience like Prince. First, the photographer must coordinate with teams and racing officials to reserve track time. The drivers of each car receive instructions regarding where they should be positioned and how fast they need to go. For this image, Prince shot out the open door of a minivan while tethered to the vehicle in a full safety harness. This setup allowed him to make adjustments by giving additional directions to a representative of the race teams, who relayed instructions via radio to the drivers of the cars and the minivan. Although he used a gyro stabilizer system to help steady the camera, he noted that bumps in the track and the turning of the vehicles made it difficult to hold the camera still.

Prince's goal was to get the cars in focus while capturing enough blur in the road surface and surroundings to create a sense of motion. He calls this photograph a winner due to the pleasing composition of the race cars, the centering of the Daytona branding on the wall, the framing created by the wall and double yellow lines, and the overall sharpness of the image.


