# You Meet the Nicest People by Rick Wasserback

We meet people every day, and now and then again you meet someone special, I met an exceptionally nice man recently, the common thread .... a Corvette, naturally. His name is Warren Fratterola, he lives in Greenwich Ct. and is an avid Corvette enthusiast, especially the C4, he attended the Club Corvette of Connecticut annual car show faithfully for over 20 years. When Warren decided it was time to part with his Corvette, not an easy car to enter and exit, especially as we get a little older and a little less agile, he brought the car to our annual car show, paid \$20 to display it in the "cars for sale" and sold the car that day! He has a great fondness for our car show and many of our members that were involved in the show, it was evident in his recollection of our shows the he attended. Warren winters in Florida, I fully understand that need, so it was time to part with part of his collection of Corvette memorabilia too, that is how Warren and I met.





Among his collection were 2 bricks from the Corvette assembly facility in Flint Michigan, home of the first Corvette.

The plant assembled the first 300 Corvettes, all assembled by hand, the very first ever rolling off the assembly line on June 30the 1953, 2 days after assembly began. Corvettes were assembled in at the Flint facility from June 1953 until December 1953, beginning the long history of Corvette production. The facility continued to produce other Chevrolet models until 1993, ultimately being disassembled in 2003 with the bricks being donated to The National Corvette Museum, Warren Fratterola purchased bricks, #7338 and #7808.





Warren decided to donate these bricks to Club Corvette of Connecticut, both still wrapped with protective foam packing, along with the Certificates – still in sealed envelopes. Ed Karedes had received a call from Warren and referred the call to me. I called Warren and ultimately spent 30 minutes on the phone with him, a man I knew I would like the minute I spoke to him. Lucyand I decided to make a day of it to pick up the bricks, we packed up the Corvette, took a scenic ride down route 15 and met Warren in Greenwich to pick up the bricks. Warren was wearing his powder blue 28 th annual car show shirt from our car show! We spent another 40 minutes talking as he proudly showed me all the photos over the years of his car at our car show. A very nice man needless to say, and one I am very happy I had the opportunity to meet.

Lucy and I ended our day meeting with friends for a late lunch – cocktail hour – early dinner – fun gathering, at a very nice water side restaurant, a short meeting, lasting about 3 hours, Lucy says I like to talk – I don't know where she gets that from. You meet the nicest people – especially those that drive Corvettes.




